

Scripture Reflection...

Today's Gospel tells us that Jesus could work no miracles in Nazareth apart from curing a few who were sick. The Nazarene's lack of faith distressed him. The Greek verbform "being distressed" has the broader meaning of being amazed or taken by surprise. We find it used four other significant times in Mark's Gospel. In the preceding chapter, everyone is amazed as the exorcised Gerasene demoniac proclaims all that Jesus has done for him. Similarly, the Pharisees and Herodians are amazed when Jesus catches them in their hypocrisy by teaching: "Render to Caesar what is Caesar's and to God what is God's." Pilate also experiences amazement, first when Jesus makes no reply to the accusations leveled against him and then again when he learns how quickly Jesus had died on the cross.

In other words, "amazement" occurs in the Gospel of Mark when people encounter faith-filled evangelizing, authoritative teaching, or a self-sacrificing witness to the faith. However, what amazes Jesus is just the opposite; the Lord is amazed and distressed at the disbelief he experiences in his hometown. And that irony is meant to make us pause and rethink.

The neighbors of Jesus presumptuously reject what even the enemies of Jesus are willing to concede. What stifles the neighbors' ability to share in real Gospel amazement is their petty, prejudiced preconceptions. The people of Nazareth do an on-the-spot assessment of Jesus' social status, family background, education and profession. And based on that myopic reckoning, they judge Jesus to be a fraud: they found him too much for them.

What causes us to find a Jesus too much for us? Whenever we attempt to evaluate or refashion Christ according to our own image, we diminish and limit Jesus who came to reveal us to ourselves. That kind of bias and dismissiveness restricts our focus and attention to our own limited experiences. If we adhere to such a closed mindedness, we miss out on the splendor and wisdom that Christ reveals to us in his humanity.

When we believe so blindly in ourselves and in our personal world view, the presence of Jesus in our midst becomes obscured. An authentic life of faith, therefore, begins in suspending all preconceived judgments. It is only in God that God's People find their full self-realization which enables us to make sense of life and all its wonders. Faith enables us to see how grace and redemption flow out of what the world would consider impossible. That is why God goes out of his way through Jesus to penetrate right to the place where we live to transform our disbelieving hearts. The lord wants us to know and share in the Mystery of Emmanuel, "God with us."

Stewardship Thought for the Week

"As the Lord spoke to me, the spirit entered me and set me on my feet, and I heard the one who was speaking say to me, 'Son of man, I am sending you...'" Ezekiel 2:2-3

God has a plan for each of us. He calls us to do something for Him. But, He doesn't leave us on our own to figure it out. He gives us the resources we need to do His work. Are you listening for God's call? When you hear it, do you get on your feet and do the work He asks of you? Do not be afraid. God doesn't call the equipped, he equips the called. Answer His call.





STV Food Pantry NEEDS your HELP!

The Parish food closet accepts donations of non-perishable foods on a weekly basis. The items collected are then delivered to our sister parish, St. Cyprian's in West Philadelphia, where approximately 300 families are assisted on a monthly basis.

Items most in need are:

powdered milk, canned fruit and 100% fruit juice, peanut butter and jelly, tuna, canned chicken, cold cereal, oatmeal, pasta and pasta sauce, rice, stew, chili and soup, toilet paper and diapers.

Food may be dropped off Monday-Thursday, 9:00am to 4:30pm and on Fridays from 9:00am to 1:00pm. Please drop off at the Parish Center and on weekends to the back of the Rosemont Chapel (around Mass times when the Church is open.)

Please be mindful of expiration dates. We cannot deliver food items which are past their expiration dates. Thank you.

If you would rather not shop, please know that financial contributions are welcome and will allow parish volunteers to buy items for the parish food closet that directly benefit the food pantry at our sister parish, St. Cyprian. You may either send a check made out to St. Thomas of Villanova (with "Parish Food Closet" on the memo line) to the parish office or drop a check in the collection basket. Electronic contributions are also an option via the parish website.

CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES

Malaria is one of the leading causes of mortality and morbidity in West Africa. In 2023, CRS, along with our partners, prevented over 3,000,000 cases of malaria in children under five. 

DO YOU KNOW YOUR TRIBUNAL?

The Tribunal is a group of specially qualified Catholics whose responsibility is to come to the help of people who have experienced divorce and who may wish to remarry in the Catholic Church.

When a divorce occurs, the Catholic Church always seeks to balance two realities. One is the unbreakableness of the bond of marriage. This is God's law. It cannot be broken by human intervention. On the other hand, the Church is concerned about the spiritual welfare of the people involved. Was this a true marriage? Even though a Catholic marriage was celebrated, was there perhaps some deficiency in the consent of the parties involved? The annulment procedure addresses this problem.


