

IMPORTANT NOTE REGARDING THE RECEPTION OF SACRAMENTS The location where you receive your sacraments is governed by the territorial boundaries of the Parish within which you live, as prescribed by the Code of Canon Law. As a reminder, and to prevent confusion or delay when the time nears for sacraments (and sacramental the preparation), reception is <u>not governed by</u> where one attends school nor by where you attend Mass nor receive Religious Education. For example, if you live in the territorial boundaries of Sacred Heart of Jesus Parish, and your 2nd grader attends Good Shepherd School in Northampton, they will receive their Religious Education from Good Shepherd School, but receive the sacrament of First Holy Communion at Sacred Heart of Jesus. SAINTS PHILIP AND JAMES, APOSTLES Feast Day-May 3rd

Saint Philip: The next day Jesus decided to go to Galilee, and he found Philip. And Jesus

said to him, "Follow me." Now Philip was from Bethsaida, the town of Andrew and Peter. Philip found Nathanael and told him, "We have found the one about whom Moses wrote in the law, and also the prophets, Jesus, son of Joseph, from Nazareth." But Nathanael said to him, "Can anything good come from Nazareth?" Philip said to him, "Come and see." John <u>1:43-46</u> When Jesus found St. Philip and said to him, "Follow me," St. Philip not only did just that but he understood who Jesus was and recruited Nathanael.

Saint James (The Lesser): After the apostles dispersed and left Jerusalem, James remained and became the first bishop in the holy city. He remained there for several decades until he was put to death by the Jewish authorities in the year 62. His work



and blood were at the foundations of the Church in Jerusalem; it was one of the greatest Sees in the Catholic Church for centuries after. In the end, while Saint James received a diminutive title after his death, it should remind us that titles really do not matter in this life or the next. All that matters is, like Saint James, we should follow God's will and strive to walk in Jesus's footsteps. Saint James teaches us that we should strive to decrease things in our life, so that God can increase in our lives.

Prayer: Saints Philip and James, you were both highly blessed to be companions of the Lord Jesus, listening to Him preach, witnessing His miracles, and receiving from Him a commission to continue His work. Please pray for us, that we will also come to know our Lord and Savior through prayer and the Holy Scriptures, so that we will be prepared for the mission that God has for us. Saints Philip and James, pray for us. Jesus, we trust in You. Amen



The old units were the original air conditioners that the Church had and were installed back in the 1970's! They are more than 30 years beyond the average life of A/C systems in today's standards, which is truly amazing! They served the church well and Sacred Heart definitely got the useful life out of them!

The new system will be more efficient resulting in lower cooling costs, less maintenance, and increased reliability. We will also have the ability to control the temperature which. although a standard feature in today's systems, is not what we had with our old system which was designed as On/Off with no ability to set the temperature! Thank you to parishioner, Rick Gower, and Fritch, Inc who have been servicing our old system, Apollo Unlimited for installing our new units, and Sacred Heart Finance, Parish Pastoral Councils and staff for managing the project.

is given to those who are seriously ill and in danger of death. When there is danger of death, please call the Pastor anytime, day or night.

GODPARENT/SPONSOR ELIGIBILITY FORMS

In order to act as a godparent for Baptism or a Sponsor for Confirmation, one must be a Catholic in good standing. Specifically this means Mass attendance every Sunday (Exodus 20:8), striving to live the moral precepts of the Church, and if married, a valid marriage in the Catholic Church.

THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

is celebrated on Sunday at Noon. If you are a parishioner and would like to schedule a Baptism, please contact the Parish Office. Prior to the baptism, parents must attend a Baptism Preparation Class which is designed to instruct the parents about the teachings of the church regarding Baptism, and to offer assistance in the spiritual preparation for their child's reception of the first of the Sacraments of the Church.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

April 28, 2024

Parishioners who are contemplating the Sacrament of Matrimony should contact the Pastor and mutually agree upon a date at least a year prior to the Wedding. The Church takes the preparation for the Sacrament of Matrimony very seriously, and requires completion of the Diocesan Marriage Preparation Program six months before the wedding. The normative time for weddings is Saturday between 10:00 AM and 1:30 PM. Weddings are not celebrated on major holidays, nor on the first weekend of June in deference to Ordination of Priests each year at that time. Either the Bride or the Groom must be a practicing member of Sacred Heart Parish in order to request a wedding date.
